ALPINE SPRINGS COMMUNITY PARK

Welcome to the 20th season of the Alpine Springs Community Park. Park Use fees will stay the same this year. Due to the amount of snow we have received so far this winter, the usual opening date of Memorial Weekend may be delayed. Check our website at www.alpinesprings.org for updates, applications and fees. Remember our parks are supported by user fees, so if you bring a guest that is not staying at your home with you, please pay the user fee for the day. You can pay at the front office or drop payment in the donation box by the bathrooms in the park. The District office hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. A Park Pass Application is attached. Please complete the application in full, including signing the application in the two designated places, and bring it to the District office with your check, payable to ASCWD, or mail in payment if you are a previous pass holder. The District now takes credit card payment. There is a 2.5% convenience fee for use of a credit card. Fees are included with the Park Pass Application and group use fees are on the District website. Group use requires advance reservations. If you have questions please call the District office at (530) 583-2342 x 3.

BOARD AUTHORIZES BOCCE BALL COURT

At the ASCWD Board meeting in April, the Board directed staff to include provisions in next year budget for a grass bocce ball court in the northeast portion of the park. The grass bocce ball court will have a manicured grass and sand surface similar to a putting green. The perimeter curbing will be constructed of weather resistant wood securely anchored to the ground. The exact dimensions will be determined in the field during construction. Two seating areas will also be provided. Players will have to provide their own bocce balls. Players are encouraged to provide the ASCWD office with feedback on their usage of the bocce ball court. Remember our parks are supported by user fees, so if you bring a guest that is not staying at your home with you, please pay the user fee for the day. You can pay at the front office or drop payment in the donation box by the bathrooms in the park.

BOOSTER PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PLANNED FOR THIS SUMMER

The District's Capital Improvement Program is planning to initiate a multiyear Booster Pump Station Improvement Project. The Project proposes to replace three existing booster pump stations with three new booster pump stations. The three existing pump stations were installed in 1963 and have exceeded their useful life expectancy and no longer have the proper pumping capacity for current and future system conditions. The current planning is to replace one Booster Pump station each year. The existing pumping capacity of each booster pump stations is approximately 60 gallons per minute. The new pumping capacity for booster pump station located on Upper Bench and Cub Lane will be 400 gallons per minute. The pumping capacity for the booster pump station located at Water Storage Tank 2 will be 200 gallons per minute.

DUMPSTERS FOR ALPINE RESIDENTS ONLY

The dumpsters that are located at the District offices are for alpine homeowners use only. No contractors should be using these dumpsters. They are for FOOD WASTE ONLY! Contractors should have a dumpster on site or you could be fined up to \$1,000. These are courtesy dumpsters provided by the District for homeowners without a bear box at the residence. Residents can put up to four 32 gallon cans and should not be put out for pick up until after 6am on Monday mornings. Pickup usually happens by 2pm. If you use the 2ml recycling blue bags those will not count toward your four can maximum. If you are interested in a bear box, TTSD has a loan program available at 0% interest for five years.
